Arizona SAR II Task Book

Task Book Overview

The AZ SAR II Task Book is designed as a recommended standard for continuing training for the dedicated volunteers of Arizona Search & Rescue. It is meant to further the training of the individual through a series of goal-oriented courses of study and evaluations.

Upon completion of this task book, the candidate will be awarded the AZ SAR II status, signifying the training level of the individual.

Tasks within the Position Task Book (PTB) are numbered sequentially; however, the numbering does NOT indicate the order in which the tasks need to be performed or evaluated.

The bullets under each numbered task are examples or indicators of items or actions related to the task, or minimum requirements for the course to be qualifying to meet standards. The purpose of the bullets is to assist the evaluator in evaluating the candidate, or as a reference for the candidate to adhere to the suggested course standards. The bullets are not all-inclusive. Evaluate and initial ONLY the numbered tasks. DO NOT evaluate and initial each individual bullet.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE POSITION TASK BOOK EVALUATION RECORD NUMBER

Each evaluator/instructor will need to generate an evaluation record for each event/incident/training where tasks are being signed off. The evaluation records should be numbered sequentially. One or more tasks may be signed off by an evaluator/instructor for a given evaluation record and corresponding event/incident/training. ASARCA approved evaluators/instructors only shall complete the next open box on the evaluation record page and write the corresponding record #, date, and location and instructor information in the appropriate columns of the PTB. Only tasks completed in a satisfactory manner will be given an evaluation record and signed off. Those tasks not completed in a satisfactory manner will be referred to the agency coordinator for re-evaluation.

Final Evaluators Verification

Upon satisfactory completion of all tasks in the PTB the candidate can submit it to their agency SAR coordinator. The SAR coordinator will then complete the Final Evaluator's Verification page and submit the PTB to the ASARCA Standards Committee.

NASAR SARTECH II Equivalency

For those who choose to complete the NASAR SARTECH II course, the following tasks listed below will be accepted as completed on the candidate's AZ SAR II task book:

Task 2 - Search Tactics

Task 3 - Land Navigation (has to include GPS training)

Task 7 - Wilderness Survival

Task 9 - Land Navigation evaluation course (has to include GPS training)

Task 10 – 24 Hour Pack Check

The tasks listed above are marked on the AZ SAR II task book with a ★. Proof of completion of the equivalent NASAR course must be presented to an ASARCA approved evaluator/instructor or agency coordinator for sign off.

Demonstrate compliance with the ASARCA suggested minimum standard of fitness</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adopted standard in the “spirit” of the Wildland Fire Pack Test at the Moderate level for Wildland Firefighters (with time added for completion) • Requires a 2 mile hike to be completed in 60 minutes with a 25 pound pack • Controlled “field test” only 			
<p> 9. Complete an evaluation course on land navigation in controlled environment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Course to be predetermined and documented by the evaluator and must be completed by the candidate individually • Course may not exceed one (1) mile of travel • Course may not be combined with another field evaluation • Candidate must locate a minimum of three predetermined markings through navigation skills • Candidate must correctly plot their location on a “hard copy” map 			
<p> 10. Present 24-hour search pack (see Attachment 1). Pack should address:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Survival • First Aid • Navigation • SAR • Personal needs 			
<p>11. Minimum Required Mission Deployment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Respond to three missions requiring field work • Missions can be cold case searches, training (mock) mission, or actual missions requiring deployment 			

Notes: Re-evaluation to demonstrate skills (sections 8, 9, 10, and 11) is recommended to be completed at a minimum of every three years.

Attachment 1-Recommended Personal Equipment List

The following is a list of equipment that are recommended to be carried in a 24-hour SAR pack. This type of pack is meant to allow the searcher to function effectively for 24 hours out in the field. Items may be on the person or in a backpack. This list is not all-inclusive, however, it is very extensive. Each SAR team leader or coordinator should identify items that are required equipment for their search areas and types of missions.

First Aid-for personal use by crew members

- 10-Acetaminophen or aspirin tablets
- 10-Antacid tablets
- 10-Antihistamine, 25mg Benadryl or equivalent
- 6-Antiseptic cleansing pads
- 1-Antiseptic ointment
- 1-Moleskin
- 4-Roller bandage
- 1-Splinter forceps, tweezers
- 1-Scissors, multi-purpose
- 1-Thermal Space Blanket
- 4-Sterile dressings (4x4 gauze pads)
- 10-Water purification tabs or purifier
- 2-Pair of latex gloves

Survival Items

- 1-Candle, long burning
- 4-Cotton swabs
- 5-10 ft-Duct Tape
- 2-Leaf bags, Large
- 16-Matches in waterproof container
- 1-Plastic bag, zip lock, qt. size to contain kit
- \$10 in coins and small bills
- 1-Razor blade, single edge
- 4-Safety pins, large
- 2-Towelette or hand wipes
- 1-Whistle
